

INSTRUCTIONS FOR CONTRIBUTORS

EQUILIBRIO ECONÓMICO, REVISTA DE ECONOMÍA, POLÍTICA Y SOCIEDAD (EE) is a semester journal (published in May and November) edited by Facultad de Economía of the Universidad Autónoma de Coahuila, Mexico, dedicated to publish the most recent advances in all areas of Economics, Politics and Social Sciences (Economic History, Regional Economics, Sociology, Demography, Economic Geography, Environmental Economics, Finance, among others). The aim of this journal is to constitute a platform where scientists, academics and essayists promote, share and discuss the several developments and problems related to the building and application of knowledge in society.

1.- The articles offered to be published in *EE* should address a theoretical or empiric topic from the fields of Economics or Social Sciences. *EE* will only consider for publication original articles, written in Spanish or English, which have not been previously published in any of their versions and should not be simultaneously proposed for this purpose in any other magazine.

3.- Authors should meet the following editorial rules:

a).- The final document must be written in Word Processor in Arial font, 12 points; all margins (superior, inferior, left, and right) of 1 inch. Graphs, tables and figures can be included within the text (as an image) in the place where desired.

b).- Articles must have 1.5 spacing and they must not exceed 25 pages. Pages must be consecutively numbered, including main text, tables, figures and references.

c).- The first page should contain: title of the article (both Spanish and English), author (or authors), institution of ascription, address to send correspondence, e-mail, fax and telephone numbers.

d).- Next, there should appear an abstract of the work, both Spanish and English, of a maximum of 100 words.

e).- Authors should provide 3 to 5 keywords (both Spanish and English) and also 3 to 5 JEL Codes, for indexing purposes.

f).- Then, the main text and references should be included.

g).- Cite references in the text by name and year in parentheses. For example, Research is complex (Rodríguez, 1990); This result was later contradicted by Robles and Smith (2000).

h).- Reference list entries at the end of the document should be alphabetized by the last names of the first author of each work; e.g.:

Journal article:

Gómez, J. and R. López (2009): "Effect of Investments in Economic growth", *Estudios Económicos*, 10:27-38.

Book:

South, J. and Blass, B. (2001): *The future of modern genomics*, London: Blackwell.

Book chapter:

Brown, B. and Aaron M. (2001): "The politics of nature", In: Smith J (ed.), The rise of modern genomics, 3rd ed. Wiley, New York, pp 230-257.

Dissertation

Trent, J.W. (1975): Experimental acute renal failure. Dissertation, University of California.

i).- Any mathematical equation that you want to number should be in Arabic numbers, in parentheses and to the right of the equation. Numbering should be consecutive.

j).- The document must have, but not be limited to, the following structure:

- Title of article
- Abstract
- Introduction
- Framework
- Development of Topic
- Conclusions
- References
- Appendix (if necessary).

k).- All proposals will be subject to two different reviews. The first one is performed by the Editorial Board to decide mainly on their suitability with the editorial policy of the *EE*; the second round is executed by two external referees.

l).- The Editorial Board of *EE* will submit the accepted article to proofreading if necessary.
